Immerse Yourself in Egon Schiele's Youth and Childhood at the Artist's Birthplace

Egon Schiele was born son of station master Adolf Schiele on June 12, 1890, in the station master's apartment in Tulln and spent the first eleven years of his life there. This period shaped Schiele in lasting ways and made up more than one third of the life of this artist, who died at age 28. Railroad engines and cars were the subject of his first works as a child.

Revamped and Refashioned

To honor Schiele, one of the major artists of his times, his birthplace at Tulln station was revamped and refashioned in mid-2013. The individual rooms in the station apartment relate moving stories about the Schiele family with the help of a modern audio system. The texts are from Egon Schiele himself, his sisters Gertrude and Melanie, his mother Marie and contemporaries of the time.



Insights into Egon's Life on the Egon Schiele Trail

On the Egon Schiele Trail, this major international artist comes to life in fascinating ways. The special theme trail takes you to all the local sights and places of importance in Egon's childhood. You hear interesting stories about this exceptional artist, e.g. why Egon's drawings went up in flames and why the Schiele family had to leave Tulln station. Historical pictures, audio texts and videos have been prepared to make the Schiele Trail an experience the whole family can enjoy.

The Stations

The 13 stations cover aspects of Egon's childhood that profoundly shaped him for his subsequent international career. Each station consists of a black, unhewn serpentine rock, a small art object by Tulln artist Gert Linke and an information panel. Interactive on-site elements are accessible via smartphone or tablet as the finishing touch of this Schiele experience.



Egon Schiele Museum - The private side of Egon Schiele

The former municipal prison on Donaulände in Tulln is the ideal starting point for a journey to explore this city's most famous son. The Egon Schiele Museum is devoted not just to Egon Schiele the person but also to the places central to his life and art. A separate treasure chamber uses original works to illuminate annually changing topics related to the artist's life. With the most modern museum technology, six stations in his work as an artist are brought to life in reenacted audio-visual interviews with contemporaries.

Schiele for all Generations

Visitors enjoy barrier-free access to the Egon Schiele Museum. Besides the multi-visual tour, the museum offers guided tours, creative programs and events for all age groups on a regular basis.
