Immerse Yourself in Egon Schiele's Youth and Childhood at the Artist's Birthplace

Egon Schiele was born son of station master Adolf Schiele on June 12, 1890, in the station master's apartment in Tulln and spent the first eleven years of his life there. This period shaped Schiele in lasting ways and made up more than one third of the life of this artist, who died at age 28. Railroad engines and cars were the subject of his first works as a child.

Revamped and Refashioned

To honor Schiele, one of the major artists of his times, his birthplace at Tulln station was revamped and refashioned in mid-2013. The individual rooms in the station apartment relate moving stories about the Schiele family with the help of a modern audio system. The texts are from Egon Schiele himself, his sisters Gertrude and Melanie, his mother Marie and contemporaries of the time.



Insights into Egon's Life on the Egon Schiele Trail

On the Egon Schiele Trail, this major international artist comes to life in fascinating ways. The special theme trail takes you to all the local sights and places of importance in Egon's childhood. You hear interesting stories about this exceptional artist, e.g. why Egon's drawings went up in flames and why the Schiele family had to leave Tulln station. Historical pictures, audio texts and videos have been prepared to make the Schiele Trail an experience the whole family can enjoy.

The Stations

The 13 stations cover aspects of Egon's childhood that profoundly shaped him for his subsequent international career. Each station consists of a black, unhewn serpentine rock, a small art object by Tulln artist Gert Linke and an information panel. Interactive on-site elements are accessible via smartphone or tablet as the finishing touch of this Schiele experience.



Early Paintings in the Egon Schiele Museum

The current exhibition features Egon Schiele's early paintings. While the artist created these works in his teen years shortly after enrolling in the Vienna Academy, their image content clearly points to Klosterneuburg. Town and landscapes are the dominant themes of these early oils, which are mostly based on sketches from nature. The current exhibition at the Egon Schiele Museum features sixteen oil paintings from 1907 and 1908, which makes it the most comprehensive show ever devoted to Schiele's early paintings.

Schiele for all Generations

The Egon Schiele Museum also offers age-specific educational programs with playful approaches to art and interactive guided tours.
